Will and Brad are 2 young male French lops who were born on 23/12/09 and they live together. As you can see Brad has a bad eye (his eyelid was ingrowing), which was untreated until the brothers came to us. He has now had a small operation to stitch back the eyelid so that his ingrowing lashes have been turned out allowing his eye to heal. The brothers are going to remain at the centre as Brad will need more surgery.

Sam is a 7 month old continental giant male who has come to the rescue. He has a extremely bad ear infection that is going to take months to clear but will probably return, he is very friendly and will stay at the centre





Sky is a young French lop female who has come to the rescue she is now 11 months and is a extremely badly tempered rabbit. She is one of the worst that we have had in for quite a time, as she is very prone to bite she will now remain with us.

Heidi is a 5 year old female Guinea Pig, who has come to the rescue after the owners children no longer bothered with her. Since arriving she has been to the vet as she has quite a large tumour underneath. As this is causing her no pain and the risk of operating is too high, she will remain here at the Centre.





Sandy is a 12 month old French lop who has come to the rescue. When she was recently spayed it has been found she has dental problems so will have to stay to enable her to have regular essential dental treatment.
